

Design 9 – Flyer Confetti

SHORT JACKET CONFETTI

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Size 36 – 40 (42 – 46)

Instructions are given for smaller size. Figure in parenthesis refers to larger size. When only one figure is given, it applies to both sizes.

Materials: 700 (800) g of Lana Grossa Confetti (100% Merino wool; 50 m/100 g) in Off White/Light Grey/Grey Blue/Charcoal (col 10). Size 10 mm needles; size 10 mm crochet hook.

Gauge: 6 sts and 10 rows = 10×10 cm in drop st patt on size 10 mm needles.

Garter st: K every row.

Drop st patt: Row 1 (RS): Selvage st, * yo, k1; rep from *, end selvage st. Row 2 (WS): Selvage st, * k1, dropping yo; rep from *, end selvage st. Rep rows 1 and 2 for drop st patt.

Slip st selvage: On every row: Sl first st pwise wyif, k last st.

Garter selvage: On every row: SI first st kwise, k last st.


Back: Cast on 40 (45) sts. Beg and end with a WS row and working first and last st as a garter selvage, work in garter st for 3 rows. Work in drop st patt until piece meas 47 (53.5) cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Bind off all sts kwise.


Left front: Cast on 20 (23) sts. Beg and end with a WS row and working a slip st selvage at front edge and a garter selvage at side edge, work in garter st for 3 rows. Maintaining selvage sts, work in drop st patt until piece meas 42 (48.5) cm from cast-on, ending with a RS row. Shape neck: At beg of WS rows bind off 4 (5) sts 1 time, 3 (4) sts 1 time and when same length as back to shoulder, bind off rem 13 (14) shoulder sts.

Right front: Work same as left front, reversing all shaping and patt placement.

Sleeves: Cast on 22 (26) sts. Beg and end with a WS row and working first and last st as a garter selvage, work in garter st for 3 rows. Work in drop st patt until piece meas 38 (40) cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Bind off all sts kwise.

Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder seams. With WS facing and crochet hook, work 1 row slip st along left front, back neck and right front edge, working 1 st in from edge. Place markers 18 (21) cm down from shoulders on front and back. Sew on sleeves between markers. Sew side and sleeve seams. Carefully weave in all ends.








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Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



Abbreviations

beg = begin(ning) \cdot **ch** = chain \cdot **cont** = continue \cdot **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) \cdot **inc** = increas(e)(ing) \cdot **k** = knit \cdot **kwise** = as if to knit **meas** = measures \cdot **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop \cdot **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop \cdot **patt** = pattern \cdot **pm** = place marker \cdot **p** = purl **pwise** = as if to purl \cdot **rem** = remain(ing) \cdot **rep** = repeat(s) \cdot **rev St st** = reverse stockinette stitch \cdot **rnd(s)** = round(s) \cdot **RS** = right side \cdot **sc** = single crochet \cdot **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch \cdot **s1** = slip \cdot **st(s)** = stitch(es) \cdot **St st** = stockinette stitch \cdot **tbl** = through the back loop \cdot **tog** = together \cdot **wyib** = with yarn in back of work \cdot **wyif** = with yarn in front of work \cdot **WS** = wrong side \cdot **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)

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
